

## LOCAL WALK .... May - HEMPNALL FIGURE OF 8 WALK



The May walk was on bank holiday Monday, where temperatures soared and East Anglia was at its most beautiful.

Being a visitor to the village I was pleased to be made so welcome by the local walkers,



chatting as we set off from Hempnall Post Office, passing the pretty thatched cottages with plants for sale in the gardens. Soon we turned off onto Pymars Lane, idyllic village life giving way to fields of rape, cow sheds, and horse paddocks, all lined with trees of apple blossom, bluebells and garlic mustard plants to name but a few.

We meandered along a tree lined path, wet underfoot and dappled with shaded sunlight and cowslips enjoying the damp atmosphere. As we emerged we needed our sunglasses for the vast expanse of canary yellow rape and a parade of horses being ridden along its far edge, we heard them before we saw them!

The next challenge was locating a plank bridge to cross between fields, once safely across we were in a glorious grass field, listening to sky larks, uninterrupted by any other kind of noise; not even a pylon to be seen on the horizon, blissful, serene Norfolk!

Across another plank bridge (through a hedge full of May flowers waiting to burst open) we reached the very edge of Redwings Horse Sanctuary, and walked round paddocks full of varying sized and coloured horses, some of which were very inquisitive little ponies! We followed the route, watching orange tip butterflies play and St Mark's flies flop about, whilst we listened to the bird song, and around the edge of a small wooded area we came across the remains of St. Mary's church. According to another walker we met, the church and surrounding settlement were abandoned due to flooding, a theory supported by the fact that some areas we walked were very damp. We stopped for a quick breather before continuing along field edges. Breaks from the brilliant sunshine were provided by beautiful, shaded, tree lined paths.



We crossed Broaden Lane, the fast cars suddenly sharpening our senses, and were soon walking around more paddocks. We disturbed a solo hare who sprinted towards the sheep in the distance. We continued in the other direction through fields of wheat toward buildings silhouetted in the sunshine, emerging on Bussey's Loke at the back of Hempnall Primary School.

A thoroughly enjoyable morning's walk, seeing the best of English countryside with a very welcoming group of individuals. Thank you!


### 2nd Long Stratton Brownies

As you would have seen from the front cover there is a chance for everyone to have a say on the future of the village and below is an explanation of what it is all about.



#### What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

The Long Stratton Neighbourhood Plan will be a document created by local people that sets out planning policy for where you live. It helps you protect the things you care about in your community, as well as make improvements to the local area. For example, it can set out how buildings should look, and for what they can be used. It can also help to encourage the kind of development of which you would like to see more.

A neighbourhood plan carries the same legal weight as plans drawn up by your local council. South Norfolk Council must follow what's in your neighbourhood plan when making decisions about planning applications in your area.

The Neighbourhood Plan committee members are aiming to have the draft plan written by the end of this year, so now's the time to give us your opinions and ideas as they are a very important part of the plan.

Please be aware that South Norfolk Council have already adopted the Long Stratton Area Action Plan (LSAAP). The LSAAP identifies Long Stratton for growth of at least 1,800 new homes and employment opportunities but it also restricts the delivery of the housing until the by-pass has been built.

After listening to the views of our community we will explore ways in which the Neighbourhood Plan can best complement the LSAAP in a way which brings benefits to our community.

#### THE MEN WHO DIED SERVING THEIR COUNTRY IN THE FIRST WORLD WAR

We look at three men who died for their country this month - Frederick William Dickerson, Walter Lewis Edwards and Clare Foulger.

#### FREDERICK WILLIAM DICKERSON

Frederick was born March 1893 in Morningthorpe. His parents were Frederick and Louise and he had a sister Francis.

He was a farm labourer and lived in Stratton St Michael lodging with the Brewington family, who were neighbours of the Betts family [featured in the April edition].



Frederick enlisted to fight in the war - at first he was in the Norfolk Regiment but was then transferred to the 1st Battalion of the Essex Regiment. He fought in the Balkans.

He was killed in action in Gallipolli on august 6th 1915, aged 22.

He is buried at Twelve Tree Copse, Krithe, Helles, Turkey and he is remembered on St Mary's Roll of Honour.

#### WALTER LEWIS EDWARDS

Walter was born in Long Stratton in March 1890. His parents were George and Sarah and he had four brothers, Arthur, William, Edward and Herbert.

In 1911 he was living in a place called Dawdon, in County Durham with the Gillum family. Walter was a bricklayer.

On April 7th 1915 he enlisted in Norwich and became a Private in Norfolk Regiment badge the Royal Norfolk Regiment, his service number was 17298. On Thursday October 5th 1916 he was killed in action.



He is buried at Mill Road Cemetery, Thiepval, Somme, France and he is remembered on St Mary's Roll of Honour.

### CLARE FOULGER

Clare was born on April 22nd 1884 in Long Stratton St Michael's.

The Foulger family moved from Bungay in 1875 to St Michael's. His father George was the estate carpenter for the Burroughs family, who lived at the Manor House at the time.

Clare's mother was Elizabeth and he had siblings - sisters Edith. Mabel, Maud and Faith and brothers George, Herbert and Clement.

The family moved to the Deals [now known as Holly House] in 1881.



Clare moved to Bungay when he was about 16 years old and became a solicitor's clerk. In 1910 he married Charlotte Tubby from Starston and the next year they went to live at Wingfield Street in Bungay. They had a baby daughter in 1913 called Freda.

Clare then decided to fight for his country and enlisted in Bungay - he was put in the 270th Seige Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery as a gunner.

Unfortunately Clare never got to go to war as while training in Aldershot he contracted spinal fever [meningitis] and on January 4th 1917 he died - a few days before he was due to go to France.

He is buried in St Margaret's Church Starston and remembered on the Roll of Honour in St Mary's Church.

### Parish Council

Wacton Parish Council has three vacancies to be filled by co-option. The minimum commitment is one evening meeting a month, usually the first Wednesday, and meetings start at 7.30pm Please contact the clerk at wactonparish@yahoo.com in the first instance, if you are interested or have any questions.

Everyone is welcome at all Parish Council meetings, held in the Village Hall and advertised in this magazine, as well as on the village notice board. Come along and find out what happens, what needs to be done and how you could contribute.

The woodland project is progressing well, with a group of year 10/11 students from Long Stratton High School coming on a regular basis to do some planting in the glades. This helps them with their personal development and to learn new social and life skills, whilst helping with community work.

A grant application has now been submitted to the National Lottery to seek funding for such things as the installation of accessible paths as well as bird and bat boxes and seating. The outcome should be known in about ten weeks.

The Tesco vote has now ended and the Parish Council would like to thank everyone who chose to put their blue token into our slot. How much funding we will get from this scheme should be known by early June and will enable us to continue work on improvements to the community woodland.

The Parish Council, along with our County Councillor – Alison Thomas, our District Councillor - Des Fulcher and affected Parishioners, have worked with Anglian Water to resolve the current issue of flooding in Wash Lane. Further works to prevent this reoccurring will take place soon.

Finally, with regards to the playing field and children's play area, the Parish Council would like to remind all dog owners that any fouling that does occur must be cleared up immediately by the owners and placed in the bins provided. If owners are caught not adhering to this, it could lead to prosecution.


To this day, I don't know the name of the runner but I do know never to give up and always try my best.



Thank you to our PPG for organising a very successful and well attended Diabetes Evening last month. We have had some very good feedback from those who went who found it an informative and worthwhile evening. They have plans to organise similar events in the future and we look forward to your support.

June 11-17th is Carers Week, which is a campaign that aims to highlight the needs of carers and to recognise their vital contribution to our community. There are approximately 6.5 million carers in the UK who provide unpaid support to family and friends, be that due to increasing age and frailty, illness, disability or mental health problems. In the region of 700,000 of these carers are under 18. Whilst providing a range of support to others it is known that carers often neglect their own health needs. When we make certain referrals, secondary care takes note of whether a patient relies on or is a carer so that additional support can be offered if necessary. We keep a register of our patients who are carers. If you feel this applies to you then please let our reception staff know. Our Carer Co-ordinator at the practice is Margaret Cobbold who is happy to help with any questions or queries that you may have.

Locally, Carers Matter Norfolk holds a wealth of advice and information with the availability of an online chat called "The Pod" where you can chat to a Carer Advisor – visit carersmatternorfolk.org.uk.
