

SEEKING SHELTER

We live in difficult, stormy times. American democracy has been challenged. We are in lockdown. Many are dying. Experts have warned of the NHS being in the middle of a great storm, facing unprecedented pressure with staff threatened by burnout. Parents are bearing the stresses of home education. Many are lonely, with others afraid for their lives, waiting in hope of being vaccinated. Many have severe financial problems. Foodbanks face great demand.

The Bible tells of the prophet, Elijah, who was facing a kind of storm. Israel was in turmoil, and people were seeking to kill Elijah. His world was being turned upside down. Even though God had at times spoken through him, he had temporarily lost confidence, lost his sense of being secure in God, and had fled to preserve his life. And then, when he was in a cave, Elijah experienced the sense of a powerful wind, then of an earthquake, then of fire. But only then did God come; he came through gently whispering to Elijah. God is often heard in the place of stillness, the place of really listening for God's voice. Elijah had sought shelter in the cave, but he is reminded that the true place of security comes from hearing God's voice and knowing of God's affirmation and acceptance. God confirms to Elijah that he has a plan for him and for his nation, and that the evil facing his nation will not prevail.

I do not know why God allows evil, but the Bible clearly says God will finally overcome it. There will be a Day of Judgment when injustices will be resolved and God's opposition to evil will be clearly revealed. God raised Jesus Christ from the dead as a sign of this and as a confirmation of Jesus's decisive personal victory over evil. Christians believe that Christ himself is God's 'voice', or 'Word', in human form: truly human and truly God. We can hear God through him as we reflect on the Bible and wait in stillness, attentive to God's presence. Christ is a shelter in the storm.

Even so, Christians also struggle in these stressful times. It is good to remind ourselves of God's affirmation and acceptance. 'In the day of trouble, he will keep me safe in his dwelling, he will hide me in his shelter' (Psalm 27:5). 'Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved' (Acts 2:21). The promise is for all who ask God for salvation: our bodies may perish, but our souls will be kept safe. We can look to Christ to shelter us and bring us into his resurrection life.

We have welcomed in 2021 with great expectations that the vaccination roll out programme will finally lead to the end of the pandemic that has been part and parcel of our lives for nearly 11 months. We are in national lockdown again as I write this article. Today PM Boris Johnson announced that over a million people in the UK have Covid. This is a scary figure and we must continue to exercise caution and follow social distancing measures.

This month I want to look at screening tests and in particular will focus on cervical cancer screening.


- 1. What is a screening test? The NHS website gives us a beautiful answer: 'Screening is a way of finding out if people are at higher risk of a health problem, so that early treatment can be offered or information given to help them make informed decisions.
- 2. What makes a screening programme reliable? Almost 53 years ago, the World Health Organisation commissioned a report on screening from James Maxwell Glover Wilson, then Principal Medical Officer at the Ministry of Health in London, England, and Gunner Jungner, then Chief of the Clinical Chemistry Department of Sahlgren's Hospital in Gothenburg, Sweden. The report, published in 1968, was entitled: Principles and practice of screening for disease.

In this advanced technological 21st century, we follow the principles laid out by Wilson and Jungner as they have proven again and again that these principles still stand true when it comes to screening programmes throughout the world.

This leads to my topic of the month - the robust cervical screening programme in the UK. The number of women dying of cervical cancer has been halved since the introduction of the programme. It is estimated that around 4500 lives are saved every year in the UK. One must remember that cervical screening is not a test for cancer. It involves identifying the high risk Human Papilloma Virus (hrHPV) which can cause cell changes that lead to cancer. If the hrHPV is detected, then a further test is done on the cervical smear sample to check for cell changes. If there are cell changes, then treatment is essential. Otherwise, these cell changes can lead to cervical cancer. Every person has the freedom to make informed choices. It is important to have as much information as possible before making a decision and the NHS website has a wealth of knowledge about screening programmes. However there is also the opportunity of discussing it with a clinician if in doubt. I take this opportunity to encourage you to take up the screening programmes when invited to do so.

CARING FOR OUR FOOTPATHS

Three years ago I answered an appeal for a Parish Footpath Warden in the Sexton's Wheel. I must have been the only applicant as I was immediately appointed. It is a voluntary post and it seems to be up to the individual warden how much he or she is prepared to put into the job. Basically the idea is to keep the Council informed on the condition of the public rights of ways – PROWs for short – in the parish. This includes the path surface, gates, stiles, vegetation growth, bridges (usually planks over ditches) and signposts. I do prepare a periodic report for the council but when I find a defect I report it straight to Norfolk Highways Dept of which PROWs are a sub-division. There is an interactive map on-line on which you can pinpoint the exact position of the problem and then fill in a form with details. It is fairly easy to use with practice. You don't necessarily get quick results; they have a very small budget. A deteriorating plank bridge I reported eighteen months ago is still languishing in the "schedule" (the pandemic has not helped here of course) and the stile near St Michael's Church is still very unsatisfactory, although signposts usually get replaced pretty quickly. I suppose that is a routine, straightforward, thing to do. It is amazing how often posts are uprooted, either by vandals or by accidents with farm vehicles. My footpaths are numbered 1-27 although a couple have been incorporated into regular pavements, for instance the little walkway from the A140 to St Michael's Road beside the car park. I try and inspect the paths at least 4 times a year and when plant life is thriving, I always take a pair of secateurs with me to try and keep the way clear; blackthorn, nettles and (especially) brambles grow at an incredible rate. Technically this is Highways job but no way have they the manpower: even field edge paths only get mown once a year now. I believe some parishes have purchased equipment to supplement this but I am not nearly strong enough to manage a strimmer man enough for the job.

Anyone can report a defect – you don't have to be a warden. However, if you come across something that should be dealt with, I would be more than happy to report it for you. My email is **bonnie.wade@tiscali.co.uk or phone 01508 531406.** 10 to 1 the footpath will turn out to be in Tharston or Morningthorpe as Long Stratton is long and narrow but I notify anything I find, recent successes including signs at Shelton and a stile in Hempnall.

It was good to see the footpaths being used more last year, a beneficial side effect of this dreadful pandemic. That helped to keep down the surface growth and made my job easier. I do hope people have enjoyed getting out more and will continue to do so when things are back to normal.

WACTON VILLAGE NEWS

Men on Wacton's Roll of Honour

This month we look at:

ALBERT WILLIAM PIDGEON
Private 14693 9th Battalion Norfolk Regiment

Although baptised Albert William Pidgeon at Tharston on 23rd February 1890 as the eldest son of Charles and Jane Pidgeon, on his attestation papers when he enlisted in the army he gave his birth place as Wacton and that he was the son of Robert Pidgeon of Wacton. Charles and Robert were brothers living at Wacton when Charles married Jane Seaman in 1889. By the 1891 Census Charles and Jane had moved into a property on the Street at Tharston with Albert but after that he was always referred to as William. After ending his schooling William worked as a bricklayer's labourer at Tharston.

On 7th September 1914 William enlisted at Norwich as Private 14693 of the 9th Battalion the Norfolk Regiment. After training they landed in Boulogne in August 1915. and moved to Loos then to the trenches overlooking the Quadrilateral near Ginchy by September 1916. On 15th September when the assault was ordered they were supposed to have support from three tanks, two failed to arrive and the third drew enemy fire and was diverted. The soldiers encountered un-broken barbed wire and the assault petered out. William was one of the many that lost their lives that day.

ALBERT PECK Private 241030 Labour Corps

Albert Peck did not enlist until 1918, he was then 54 years old and joined the Labour Corps who provided support to the fighting men - cooking, laundering and moving supplies as well as maintaining roads, railways and buildings. Albert was a brick layer by trade so his expertise was needed in the rebuilding on the Continent. Listed as an absent voter (NM) in 1918 and not registered to vote in 1919 suggests his service lasted until 1920 when he returned to Wacton.

He was born in Wacton and was one of the first councillors of the Parish Council then acted as Parish Constable or several years. He probably lived at North End Farm on the Common until 1908 when he moved to the Victoria Cottages, the Green.

He was a married man with five grown up children, of which two boys were already in the army and one a police officer in London.

Of the two boys who enlisted only Ernest Albert is mentioned on the Wacton Roll Of Honour.(172w)

ERNEST ALBERT PECK Private 77739 Royal Field Artillery

The youngest of Albert's boys, Ernest Albert, was working as a barman when he enlisted on 23rd June 1914 in London and by April 1915 was in France. Throughout has wartime service he appears to be a 'driver', one of the men who rode and guided one pair of horses moving artillery guns and other wagons.

By the end of that year he was in Salonika and spent a year there, transferring to the Royal Sussex Regiment in February 1917 then in June to the Labour Corps, which suggests he was recuperating from injury and not 'A1' fit. In 1918 he was in the UK and married Marjorie Winslade in Chichester. He returned to active service in August with the Suffolk Regiment before rejoining the RFA. He remained in service after the war, re-engaging in 1926 and finally being discharged in 1934.

He is on the 1918 register of electors as an Absent voter (NM) at the Green, Wacton, and at 6 Victoria Cottages, now 11 Hall Lane, in 1932 although that was also his parents' address. The military records show he was discharged to Bustards Green, Forncett. He was buried at Wacton in 1969. (193w)




